An Act for setting an new Court House at Annapolis within the same County as aforesaid according to Engagements

An Act for securing of Executors and Administrators from double Paying of debts and limiting of the time for Payment of Obligations within this Prov<sup>t</sup> as aforesaid

An Additional Act to the Act for the better Administration of Justice in Probat of Wills Granting Administrations recovering of Legacies and Securing of Fiducial Portions as aforesaid

An Act for Regulating Ordinaries and limiting the Number of them within this Province as aforesaid

An Act restraining the frequent assembling of Negroes within this Province as aforesaid

An Act for the laying an Imposition upon Negroes Slaves and White Servants Imported into this Province as aforesaid

An Additional Act to the Act for Religion the former Amendments thereto agreed to being left out Proposed that the Minister be exempt from Tyne that the Book be found at the Parish Charge that instead of saying the Oaths of Allegiance and Obedience it be said the Oaths appointed by Act of Parliament to be taken instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy and that a Clause therein be inserted against common Swearers and Drunkards

Brought from the House by Mr Boothby and Mr Lowe the following Bill viz

An Additional Act to the Act for Ports read and Proposed that no Actions be brought in the said Courts exceeding the sum of 100 Sterling or 20000 Tobacco And that no Appeal be allowed under the sum of 50 Sterling and that therein it be provided that my Lord Baltimore's Officers be Obliged to reside in the
