Came from the House of Burgesses Captain Taker Major Maxwell and Mr Fry who acquaint his Excellency and the Board that they were sent to the House to signify that they were adjourned for an hour but if his Excellency had any present Service to Command them Mr Speaker would have the House to meet sooner by beat of Drum

His Excellency was pleased to give Order and recommend to the several Gentlemen of the Council that they would be diligent in seeing all the Laws formerly made and now to be Defect fully put in Execution
