22 Proposed it is Ordered whether the Justices have such power of attorney in a Clerk or Clerk of Indictments and that the lawyers before called herein which if Judged that they have no such power that then such power be added to their Commission.

Proposed whether the late Act of Parliament made in Relation to Quakers Sacking will take place in this Province the said Law being sent for the advice of the House and Lawyers thereof and if the same be adjudged not to take place hereof proposed whether the House think it necessary to make a law in this Province conformable to the said Act of Parliament for the use of the Quakers here residing.

Upon his Excellency's proposal by the Honble Col Robotham and Col Addison this morning sent in relating to the Cleaning of Captain Pellow by following House Committed to regard there is a Fleet in the County now upon saying that it will not be any way prejudicial to his Majesty's service that the said Ship should be immediately cleaned.
