viewing the said House &c shall some rewards &c be given upon the back of the Kings
Picture where it from the dampness of the walls also a fort with Railings to it to have
the King all the manner measured by putting some Board on the back side thereof
to keep it from falling it is recommended that some care be taken about regulating the
Ordinances and that none be suffered except such as will comply with the law

That some law or Ordinance be made for the better securing Letters brought into the
Country of Ships

That some laws are may be taken about Orphans and Encouragement given to Co-
opers and Taynters for want whereof there are great complaints from all Parts of the
Country

Came from the House of Delegates Captain Willm Waller, Mr Samuel Mr Hopkins

lected and made out there in presence of his Excellency and Council and members of the
House of Delegates and for that purpose

Brought also the following Message which was read viz

By the House of Delegates March the 15 1698

This House do desire that the honorable Board will appoint some of their members
to goe with some officers in order to consider what methods will be best to be taken in re-
lation to our neighbouring Indians and for securing the frontier plantations

Ordered that the honorable Col George Robottom Thomas Finch Esq Col Charles Hutch-
inson and Colonel John Addison to join with some of the members of the House to consult
about the Indians according to request so soon as time and place is agreed on

That there be a certain sum of Pounds presented to be taken by the several Officers of
the Province and Surge for that there be no disorder kept in Court Houses where Records
are kept especially Talbot and Somerset County Court Houses and that there be a Buck Chim-
ney to each Court House if any at all and that the said Houses be pulled down and no others
erected to join to them that there be letter pieces of Pgs full near the Court Houses or at
least where a large store with a shipping Room and Pillory and that some man be
agreed unto to keep such House for safe office &c

That the trees that are left in the middle of the Roads be cut down and that there be
in well places the roads cleared wider than twenty feet

That Protestant Servants that live with Roman Catholics have liberty to go to
Church
