But if your Excellency will condescend to let the humble Address of his Majestys Subjects shew such mark of your displeasure to them as to consent with them that the Gentlemen each of them pay ten Shillings a Piece to our Sergeant at Arms and suffer the said Paper to be burned and never to be presented to your Excellency of course you will give us reason to magnify your Justice and lenityes to preserve our Rights and to be always sensible of your Excellencies Honour and to pray for your long continuall prosperity

The Council upon late audience Presented Yesterday

Upon Representation that the several Sheriffs do grievously burthen the Inhabitants of this Majestys Province in charging excessive fees especially upon Persons lying under Execution where they usually charge twenty shillings during their Imprisonment for each particular Execution the Prisoner is served with therefore proposed that a Law be made to redress such Grievance respecting the fees and punishment of Persons lying under Execution

His Excellency is pleased to command Mr Speaker and the whole House immediately to attend him in Council to settle the matter about the Indians reported by the Committee being one of the principal things for which the Assembly was called

Upon reading the first part of the Committee concerning the Indians the House considering by your Excellencies good conduct and well knowing you never required us to make any charges to him by report to your Excellencys discretion to convene the Rangers at new Scotland at such place as you shall think fit until the Indians become so but humbly advise that it may be sooner the Indians want that they may hear any alarm upon occasion and that upon accommodation with the Indians your Excellency will be pleased to call in those Rangers whom this House do not think fit to be kept out
