His Excellency reads to the Honorable Judges before themselves
a report for the same and the same for the Transcript of the Body of Laws
of the Province of New Brunswick taken on the 2^d of September 1697
23 of February 1698

The printed Book lately by his Excellency received from the Judges
contains a plan relating to the last Spring or Summer the said Judges
of the House do consent to have some small Tombs built there in the nature of an
Hospital to receive some money for Burial being advised that Building thereof

Recommended to the House that they would appoint a Committee to view the
Accounts of the Province that the several Accounts might appear fully made and that a
Committee be made of what belongs to the Free School And that the said Committee
may examine and take the Charge of the Building the said House that it may be
Publicly known for Satisfaction of the Country and all others desiring to see the same
That the House a Copy of Mr. and Mrs. late Outside Account from enquire
what several of them had relation to many things done in the House the last Spring

His Excellency comes to the House then Inquiring to have the Clerk of their
House Inquire of every tell them that he does not understand what they mean they
but say he thinks it very unpardonable to take the Speeches of their House to keep
a Journal but say they themselves may examine the proceedings during the sitting
of the House at their Pleasure Tells them that he is willing that both the Honorable
his Majesty's Council and several members of the House should be sworn to Secrecy
and this to prevent their being told what is said in the House

Lately his Excellency is pleased to tell the House that ever since he had the Honour
to receive his most Excellent Majesty in the Nation he hath Prayed him to Place him
in his most Excellent Majesty but for the glory of God the Service of his Majesty and the
Good of this Province to which end he prayeth Almighty God to direct
them

Whereupon Mr. Fisher and the Deputies take their leave of his Excellency and the
Board and return to the House

Then came from the House of Deputies Mr. William Mather and appears
Philip Mather and tells that Mr. Gage might be made Clerk of their House
and accordingly Mr. Gage was sworn
