By his Majesty's honorable Council in Parliament  
Several Papers being the Treaty of Trade made betwixt John Thompson and others  
with the Indians at the head of the Bay is referred to the consideration of your House  
for your Opinion whether it may not be better able to send to his Excellency the Governor  
of New York to request him that several Indians are sent upon Susquehanna  
and Patuxent to that Inquiry to make whether they do not belong to the five Nations  
or to any the Indians under his Government which if they be this Government will  
not harbour entertain or Protect them

Altho' of his most Excellent Majesty's Royal Instructions to his Excellency the  
Governor concerning Liberty of Conscience which hath sent you for your Opinion  
Whether the Roman Catholics within this Province have not forfeited such his  
Majesty's favour here

We have Pleas'd that the honorable Thomas Touch and James Fuby Esqrs  
should be joyn'd to a committee of such members of your House as you shall think  
fit to appoint to Enquire the publick Accounts sent his Excellency's Assent to the  
Government which are by Law recommended to be examined and stated that they  
have drawn in the following Remarks viz Upon W<sup>m</sup> Samuel Watkins Account that by  
Common Report W<sup>m</sup> Beckett Imported about 50 Negroes the W<sup>m</sup> Watkins gives the  
Country credit only for 32

That the committee Enquire Whether Major Wellington paid the Ballance of  
his Expences due to the Country

To Enquire into the several Accounts the Sheriff hath given the Publick Treasurers  
of the Superior Tribunal Office

That the accounts of Fees to the Free Schools be examined and made up apart from  
the Country Revenue
