It being debated in Council whether it might not  
be fitting upon the late Murder committed by Indians  
upon Thomas Thick penny and his wife in Prince Georges  
County, to have a certain young Indian Lad at Capt. ...  
son to the Emperor of Piscataway secured and kept in  
Nature of an hostage untill some Satisfaction had  
to that Murder.

The Securing the said Indian Lad is not thought  
convenient at this time. — But it is advised that the  
Frontier be well secured untill such time as y<sup>e</sup> Assembly  
meets — and that Col. Beale continue ranging and endeavour  
to make some discovery if possible of y<sup>e</sup> said Indians that  
wer concerned in that Murder.

Resolved that Colonel Addison Col. Curtis Col. Beale Col.  
Smallwood and Mr John Hawkins acquaint y<sup>e</sup> Indians  
that are adjacent to them and cause in securing to be  
our Friends that they may expect very good treatment  
from this Government on their good Behaviour.

It being Mr John Hawkins say sold the ...
