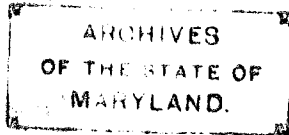


I hope and ~~some~~ promised or otherwise they

His Majesty assures them that he will always  
have two Courts one for the English and one  
for the Indians.

His Majesty tells the Emperour of Russia  
that in case his Indians are refractory &  
will not be kept within bounds and measure  
but do such irregular things as will be  
offensive to that he cannot rule, to send them  
to him who has 20000 Men under his command  
and he will punish them.

The Emperour says if he shall come to live at  
Adowick or Samunchoy. To which it is answered  
he may at either of them which he likes best  
and that he shall be well used. For that His  
Majesty will take care that notwithstanding  
there be an Ordinance made for their quiet and  
rest so that no body shall come to disturb  
them in their Lands or anything belonging  
to them. And as to the Emperour for building  
his house he is directed to apply to the Assembly  
by sending some of his men when the next  
Assembly shall.
