They are told of their breach of Articles
and asked if they are desirous for to enter into
new Oath - To which they say they are. -

And it being concluded and agreed upon -
That the Emperor should with his Wife and
Children ^{within two months} come in and live at Samunkey &
do his utmost Endeavour to persuade
the rest of the Indians to do so likewise.

Ordered that Articles of Peace be signed
with the Agreem. last mentioned inserted
in all other points as they were before. -

Ordered also that Articles of Peace be
inspired for the Samunkey Indians
And then by say was pleased to give every
one of the said Indian presents, and of
greater value to Colonel James for by M^r.
the Queen of Samunkey by the Emperor
Anderson King Peter and others of greater
Note -

And then told them to come
again to morrow morning to sign
the said Articles of Peace -
