

their Masters and come to any of the Indian  
Towns within the Territorys of the Said -  
Oquitos maguach and his Subjects they shall  
be bound to apprehend the Said Fugitives  
bring them to the Said most English Plantation  
to be conveyed to their Ma<sup>ty</sup>. And in case any  
Indian shall convey or assist any such  
Fugitives in their flight out of the Province  
that he shall make the respective Master or  
Masters of such Towns or Slaves such  
Satisfaction as an Englishman ought to do  
in the like Case.

7thly - That the Said Oquitosmaguach shall not  
make any new peace with our Enemies  
nor shall make any War without the  
Consent of the Governour of the Province  
for the time being.

8thly. In case the Said Oquitosmaguach or any  
Indian Subject to him shall kill any Indian  
or any other in peace and Amity with his  
Said Ma<sup>ty</sup>. It shall be esteemed as great an  
offence as killing an Englishman.

9thly  
That neither the Said Governour nor any  
of the Judiciary under his Subjection shall  
at any time hereafter receive Harbour or  
shelter amongst them or within their  
ports any foreign or strange Indians  
or know or discover any such to appear or  
come within the Province without  
quietly and secretly to the Said Governour
