Articles of Peace and Amity concluded
and agreed upon between
William the third of England
and Government of Virginia and over
the right province of Maryland
and Territory thereto belonging
the Queen of Denmark

It is agreed upon that from this day
forward there be an inviolable peace
amity between by most Excellent Majesty
William the third of England and his Subjects
the Inhabitants of the province and
Town of New York Queen of Denmark
upon the Articles hereafter mentioned to the
words end to endure, and that all former
Acts of Hostility and Damages what soever by
either party sustained be buried in perpetual
Oblivion

2^d That if any Indian Subject to the said
New York shall hereafter be carried to sell an
Englishman the said New York
shall be obliged to deliver such Indian unto
the Governor of the province as a prisoner

3^d Forasmuch as the English cannot easily
distinguish one Indian from another
That no Indian shall come into any English
plantation planted, and that if any
shall be found to call aboard of any ship
within three hundred paces of any English man
leave ground, and by any means
whether Gunny, Gun, or Ammunition or other
Weapons for any Englishman
