treachery from some Indians that live here and the
other Nations that the said Emperors sell home their Indians
on this side the Bay, Least any injury should be done
upon any violence or injury offered by other Indians

Whereas there was a proposal made last Assembly
for paying the publick and private Loans in Money
and not in Tobacco, This Excellency is pleased to ask the
Advice of the Board if they think it would be
his Tobacco would be made, To which the Gent^l of the hon^{ble}
Council say that they do not believe it would have
any such effect that there will be the same quantity of
Tobacco made as well then as before.
