his Majesty to disallow of any of those Acts -
without making void the whole, and we did
oblige us because of some things that we
found not fit to be allowed to report to his
Majesty our humble opinion that the foresaid
Act might be disallowed which his Majesty
has been pleased to do accordingly.

We are further to observe you that our
Act for the Service of Almighty God -
and the Establishment of ye Protestant
Religion having been enacted long formerly
and disallowed by his Majesty in 1645 was
nevertheless renewed in 1690 and now
again in 1699 without any Material al-
-teration in the thing for which it was
