His Excellency is pleas'd to inquire into the
Security those Gent^l have given for the
Execution of their Offices and finding that
M^r Robert Mason and M^r Philip Clark who
were M^r Muschamp's Securitys are both dead
his Excellency is pleas'd to require other new
Security.

M^r Carter and M^r Muschamp are ordered to
Lodge a Copy of their Accounts of the 3rd 6th 10th for
terms in the Book of the Councils Office yearly
that that Revenue may appear. The said Gent^l
Retire

Upon the Death of M^r James Quindens one of
the Justices of the Provinciaall Court ordered
that M^r William Whittington succeed him

His Excellency proposes to the Board if it may
