into viz. That they are well assured under the  
Proprietary Government of this Province there  
were no Oaths of Allegiance or other Obligatory  
Oaths to his Majesty imposed upon or administered  
to any person within this Province whether  
of the Council Justices or any of Ministerial  
Officers but that such persons only took an Oath  
of Fidelity to his Highness the Proprietary and other  
Oaths for the due Execution of their respective  
Offices.
