WE have taken your message of the 29th instant by Mr. Grahame into consideration, and have concurred therewith in every particular, except that part which proposes the five judges of the court of appeals to be appointed by the joint ballot of both houses; we apprehend your honours have not adverted to the form of government, which empowers this house to send up a list of all officers in the nomination of the governor and council to your honours for your approbation; after such list sent up, should we disagree in opinion, a joint ballot will then be necessary.

Our list of officers, judges and magistrates, is nearly compleated, and we intend fending it up with all possible dispatch, after we have an answer to our message ascertaining the number of naval officers and their districts. Permit us to remind your honours that we have fet many weeks, and the civil officers, judges and justices, are not yet agreed upon. We are of opinion many evils may attend too long delay, and therefore request an answer to our message concerning na-

val officers as foon as you can with conveniency.

We see the importance of filling all the civil offices of government, and wish that business may be done as soon as you have agreed upon the different officers to be proposed to this house. If we have erred in the proposition made to you in the conclusion of our message of the 29th by Charles Grahame, Esq; our error arose from having copied expressions made use of in your message by Messieurs Crabb and Polk, and not from a desire to encroach in any degree upon the privileges of your house.
