That your committee find, by a report in November session 1765, it appears that the sum of £ 73 17 2 gold currency was then due from the collector of the land-tax in Queen-Anne's county, for the half year ending the 29th day of September 1763, and that the said sum hath not yet been paid in.

Your committee further take leave to report, that from the multiplicity of business, the nature of the trust, and the care and regularity of the transactions, they are of opinion that the commissioners and clerk's annual salaries have been inadequate to the services they have rendered the public.

That your committee, in pursuance of the authority vested in them, have received from the said commissioners the several and respective balances herein before mentioned, together with the stamps and flowers for striking and printing the several emisions, and likewise all the bonds, books, papers, and all other things whatsoever belonging to the said office, and have delivered the same over to the commissioners appointed by the house of delegates, as by the said commissioners receipt hereunto annexed will appear.

All which is submitted to the consideration of both houses of assembly, this fourth day of June, anno domini 1777.
