

In the seventeenth line of same page, after the word "western," strike out the words "or eastern."

In the eighteenth line of same page, strike out "June" and insert "September."

Strike out from the word "June," in the same line and page, to the word "and" in the tenth line of the second page, and insert as follows, "who shall lock them up in the iron chests or other safe place, which bills of credit shall be counted and burnt by a committee of both houses of assembly, to be appointed at the next session after the said first day of September next."

In the eleventh line of the second page, make the word "acts" "act." In the twelfth line of same page, strike out the words "one of the said treasurers," and insert "the treasurer aforesaid." And in the last line of the same page, strike out "June," and insert "September."

In the first line of the third page, strike out the fourth word "an" and insert "the said." In the sixth line from the bottom of fourth page, after the word "trustees," insert "aforesaid, or trustee herein after directed to be appointed."

After the word "exchange," in the fifth line from the bottom of the fourth page, strike out to the end of the preamble, and insert as follows, "and it is therefore reasonable that the holders of the said bills of credit, who are compelled by this act to bring in the same, should have it in their option either to receive bills of exchange drawn as by this act is provided, or certificates in payment for the said bills of credit."

In the second line of the fifth page, strike out "April" and insert "September."

In the ninth line of the same page, after the word "exchange," insert "or any of them."

Strike out from the word "paid," in the tenth line of the fifth page, to the word "and," in the eleventh line, and insert as follows: "the same shall be renewable, but neither the drawer or any endorser thereof shall be answerable for, or liable to pay, any damages thereon, other than the charges of protest."

Strike out from the word "bills," in the twelfth line of the same page, to the word "hereby," in the first line of the sixth page, and insert as follows:

"*And*, Whereas the said trustees may refuse or neglect to act: *Be it enacted*, That one of the following persons, viz. Edmund Jennings, William Carmichael, Joshua Johnson, Jonathan Williams, or Richard Bennet Lloyd, Esquires, shall be appointed in manner herein after directed, to act as trustee, in case of such refusal or neglect, which person, so appointed trustee for and on behalf of this state, shall be and he is."

In the fourth line of the sixth page, strike out the words "either of them are," and insert "he is."

Between the words "the" and "trustees," in the sixth line of same page, insert the word "said," and after the said word "trustee" insert the word "shall," and in the seventh original line of same page, strike out the words "who shall act shall."

In the eighth line from the bottom of the sixth page, strike out the words "said trustees," and insert "persons before named."

In the last line of the same page, strike out "trustees," and insert "persons."

In the third line from the bottom of the last page, strike out the word "acts," and insert "act."

The bill, entitled, An act for recruiting the quota of troops of this state in the American army, was read the second time by especial order and with the proposed amendments will pass:

Amendments proposed. In the fourth line from the bottom of the fifth page, after the word "lieutenant" insert "or any field officer." In the last line of the same page, after the word "lieutenant," insert "or field officer." After the last enacting clause in the bill insert the two following clauses:

"*And*, Whereas the times of enlistment of sundry privates and non-commissioned officers in the quota of troops of this state, serving under his excellency general Washington, will expire during the course of the year seventeen hundred and eighty:

*Be it enacted*, That the governor and council shall, from time to time, transmit to general Smallwood, or in case of his death or absence to the next commanding officer of the said troops, such sums of money as may be necessary for paying the same bounties to any of the aforesaid privates and non-commissioned officers, who may re-enlist in any of the regiments of this state for three years or during the war, as are meant to be given by this act to new recruits.

*And be it enacted*, That the same bounty in lands shall also be given to each private and non-commissioned officer aforesaid, and in such manner as by this act is provided to be bestowed on the new recruits enlisting within this state."

The said three last mentioned bills were sent to the house of delegates by Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Esq;
