RESOLVED; That the surgeons now in the quota of troops belonging to this state, shall have and receive, within this state, a similar quantity of land to that which the captains in the line are entitled to by the resolution of congress of the 16th of September, 1776; and that the surgeons mates shall receive a quantity similar to the lieutenants in the line; and that the same shall be exempted from taxation whilst they continue in the possession of such surgeon or surgeons mates, and before any alienation thereof made, and not after.
