Between the words " same" and " shall," in the 8th line from the top, insert, "has been brought to some public warehouse, and there inspected by persons appointed for this purpose, or acting as inspectors, or unless the same." Page 31. After the word " offending," in the 13th line from the top, insert, " shall be punished with whipping, not exceeding thirty-nine lashes, and standing in the pillory, and by servitude, not exceeding five years, to pay the expences of profecution, and redress the party or parties injured, in the discretion of the court before whom such offenders shall be convicted." Strike out from the word " shall" in the 14th line to the word " clergy" in same line. Page 52. In the 7th line from the bottom, after the word "making," insert "sale." Page 56. After the word "in," in the third line from the top, insert, "the new bills of credit, to be issued in wirtue of the act for finking the quota required by congress of this state of the bills of credit emitted by congress, at the rate of twelve shillings and six-pence per hundred, or in the present circulating paper currency, at the rate of twenty-five pounds per hundred."
