The senate met.

A petition from John Trammell, of Frederick county, was read, and sent to the house of delegates by Matthew Tilghman, Esq; thus endorsed; "By the senate, July 1, 1780: Read and sent to the house of delegates.

Messieurs Key and Mackall, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president a bill, entitled, An act to direct the recording and to give effect to a deed made by Philip Read and Anne his wife, of Saint Mary's county, to George Medley, endorsed; "By the house of delegates, July 1, 1780: Read the first and second time by especial order and will pass.

Messieurs Chaille and Job, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, JULY 1, 1780.

RESOLVED, That twenty-eight pounds per diem be allowed to each member, for his attendance during this session of assembly, and twenty-eight pounds per diem for itinerant charges, and thirty pounds for boat hire for each member from the eastern shore.

Messieurs Maccubbin and Alexander, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president the engrossed bill No. 15, with the paper bill thereof, which engrossed bill was thus endorsed; "By the house of delegates, July 1, 1780: Read and assented to.

The bill to direct the recording a deed made by Philip Read, &c. was read the first and second time by especial order, passed with the following amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by Charles Carroll, Barrister, Esq;

Amendment proposed. After the last clause insert, "Provided always, That nothing in this act shall be taken or construed to supersede, or in any manner to affect, the operation of any deed executed by the said Philip Read and Anne his wife, or either of them, for a full and valuable consideration, to any bona fide purchaser or purchasers, without notice, which hath been or may be recorded, before recording the said deed from the said Philip Read and Anne his wife to the said George Medley."

On motion, Leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to lay a general embargo.

Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq; brings in and delivers to the president the same; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act to prohibit for a limited time the exportation of wheat, flour, &c. was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq;

Messieurs Brown and Lawson, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of certain nonjurors, endorsed; "By the house of delegates, June 30, 1780: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendments proposed. Page 1. Strike out in the title the words "A bill," and insert the words "An act."
