By THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 2, 1780.

On reading the representation of captain John Rudolph, setting forth, that he was appointed by colonel Henry Lee, jun. to purchase dragoon horses, for his legion, and was directed by him to apply to this state for money to defray his expences, RESOLVED, That the governor and the council be requested to draw their order on the treasurer of the western shore, to pay the said captain Rudolph twelve thousand continental dollars, for which he is to be accountable to major-general Greene, and that the said money be charged to the United States.

Which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq;

The senate proceeded to ballot for a register of wills in Queen-Anne's county, the ballot box was prepared, and the ballots deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to the committee of this house appointed to meet the committee of the other house, who retired to the conference room, examined the ballot box, returned, and reported, that Solomon Clayton had a majority of votes. Whereupon it is declared in the senate, That Solomon Clayton, Esq; is duly elected register of wills for Queen-Anne's county.
