

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, MAY, 1781.

ORDERED, That Matthew Tilghman and Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esquires, wait on the house of delegates, and inform them, that the Governor is now attending in the senate to sign and seal some engrossed bills passed this session, and request their attendance.

The house of delegates appeared, and the following engrossed bills were presented by the speaker of the house of delegates to his Excellency, who signed and sealed the same in presence of both houses.

No. 20. An act to explain and amend the act to settle and adjust the accounts of the troops of this state in the service of the United States, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 21. An act to direct the recording of a deed from John Starkey to Joshua Donoho, of Cecil county.

No. 22. An act to direct the granting letters testamentary on a copy of a will proved where the testator dies.

No. 23. An act for the emission of bills of credit not exceeding two hundred thousand pounds, on the security of double the value in lands, to defray the expences of the present campaign.

No. 24. An act to ascertain officers fees in special courts.

No. 25. A further Supplement to the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-one.

No. 26. A Supplement to the act to continue and explain the powers vested in the special council appointed on the eastern shore.

No. 27. An act to explain and amend the act for the better security of the government.

No. 28. An act to prevent disaffected emigrants from settling in this state, and to detect and punish the disaffected, and to prevent any correspondence or trade with the enemy, and to punish certain misdemeanors.

No. 29. An act to continue the acts of assembly therein mentioned.

No. 30. An act to abrogate and abolish part of the thirty-seventh article of the form of government.

No. 31. An act to abrogate and abolish the forty-fifth article of the form of government.

No. 32. An act to alter part of the fifty-fifth article of the form of government.

No. 33. An act to secure the certain redemption of the bills of credit emitted by this state, and for which confiscated British property was pledged.

No. 34. A Supplement to the act for the defence of the bay.

No. 35. A Supplement to the act to settle and adjust the accounts of the troops of this state in the service of the United States, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 36. An act relating to public creditors.

No. 37. An act to dispose of certain confiscated British and forfeited property.

No. 38. An act for the payment of the journal of accounts.

The senate adjourns to the third Monday in September next.

So end the proceedings of this session, this twenty-seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-one.
