Amendments proposed. Strike out the proviso in the 2d page, and insert, "under such restrictions and provisions as to bringing suits, as are or may by law be imposed on citizens of this state." In the 7th line of the 2d page, after the word "state," insert, "or any of the United States." In the 13th line of same page, strike out the word "intendant," and insert "governor and council."

The bill, entitled, An act to empower Thomas Contee to settle and collect the debts due to William and Robert Mollison, or either of them, and to apply the same, was read the second time, passed with the proposed amendments, and, with the above memorial, sent to the house of delegates by Richard Barnes, Esq;

Amendments proposed. Strike out from the word "provided," in the 22d line of the 1st page, to the word "effects" inclusive, in the 2d line from the bottom, and insert, "under such restrictions and provisions as to bringing suits as are or may by law be imposed on other citizens of this state."

In the 16th line of the 2d page, strike out the words "treasurer of the western shore," and insert "governor and council."

Strike out the words "treasurer aforesaid," in the 3d line and 3d page, and insert "governor and council."

The
