BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, JUNE 15, 1782.

On considering the resolve of congress of the 20th of February last, and the letter from the superintendant of the finances of the United States of the 7th of May last, informing that he had nominated Mr. Daniel de Saufure commissioner to settle the accounts between this state and the United States, and to liquidate certificates and other claims by citizens of this state against the United States, agreeable to the resolve of congress, and requesting the approbation of the legislature of the said commissioner for the purpose aforesaid,

RESOLVED, That the general assembly approve of the appointment of the said Mr. de Saufure, and do direct the intendant of the revenue and the auditor-general, treasurers, and all other officers of this government, to furnish the said commissioner with accounts, vouchers, and all things necessary, to enable him to state and adjust the account of this state with the United States.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, JUNE 15, 1782.

RESOLVED, That it is the opinion of this general assembly, that this state ought to credit the United States, by Mr. Conrad Theodore Wederstrandt, for the sum of five thousand one hundred and eighty-two pounds and nine-pence specie, for seven thousand nine hundred and ninety-six and three quarters bushels of wheat, purchased by him for the use of the continent, and seized by officers of this state; and that the governor and council be requested to give Mr. Wederstrandt a certificate of said credit having been duly entered in favour of the United States.
