The above resolutions were sent to the house of delegates by John Henry, Esq;

The paper bills from No. 1 to No. 39 inclusive, except No. 3, 16, 24, 25, 31, 32, 33, and 34, were sent to the house of delegates by Samuel Hughes, Esq;

His Excellency the Governor attending in the senate, ORDERED, That John Henry and John Smith, Esquires, wait on the house of delegates, and inform them, that his Excellency the Governor is now attending in the senate, for the purpose of signing and sealing the engrossed bills, and request their attendance.

Messieurs Roberts and Shriver, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president the resolution postponing executions against the purchasers of Nanticoke manor, endorsed; "By the house of delegates, June 1, 1783: Read and assented to.

The house of delegates appeared in the senate, and the following engrossed bills were presented by the speaker of the house of delegates to his Excellency the Governor, who signed the same and affixed the great seal thereto in presence of the members of both houses, viz.

No. 1. An act respecting registers of vessels, and to direct the entry and clearing vessels from and to the British dominions.

No. 2. An act for the relief of John Buckman, of Saint Mary's county.

No. 3. An act to change the surnames of Nicholas Maccubbin, junior, and James Maccubbin, to that of Carroll.

No. 4. An act to make valid a deed of bargain and sale executed by Abraham Davis and Elizabeth Cromer, of Frederick county, to Joshua Gift, of said county.

No. 5. An act for laying out a road from the wind-mill and dwelling plantation of Nathaniel Manning, of Dorchester county.

No. 6. An act for laying out a road from John Groff's mill in Frederick county.

No. 7. An act to authorize and empower Frank Leeke, of Prince-George's county, to dispose of a tract of land called Wells's Invention, for the purpose therein mentioned.

No. 8. An act to continue the civil causes depending in the general court for the western shore, and for other purposes.

No. 9. An act for removing original papers in the late ~~public~~ office, to the several courts in this state.

No. 10. An act giving a further time for the payment of the taxes levied for the present year, and other purposes therein mentioned.

No. 11. An act to establish a market-house in Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, and for the regulation of the same.

No. 12. An act to authorize the auditor-general to settle and adjust the accounts and pay of the honourable Robert Hanson Harrison, Esquire.

No. 13. An act to appoint trustees to take care of the person and property of Joseph Enfor, an idiot.

No. 14. An act for the sale of the glebe land in Shrewsbury parish in Kent county.

No. 15. An act for laying out a road leading from doctor Ephraim Howard's tilting-forge, in the upper parts of Elk-Ridge, to intersect the public road leading to Elk-Ridge Landing, by William Hobbs's dwelling plantation, in Anne-Arundel county.

No. 16. An act empowering the intendant to dispose of the galley and barges.

No. 17. An act concerning the admission and qualification of solicitors and attornies.

No. 18. An act to authorize and empower Charles Greenbury Ridgely, son and heir at law of Charles Greenbury Ridgely, late of Anne-Arundel county, deceased, jointly with Sarah Ridgely and Henry Ridgely, administrators of the said Charles Greenbury Ridgely, deceased, to sell and dispose of a part of the real estate of the deceased, for the payment of his debts.

No. 19. An act for the relief of Charles Dunkin, of Worcester county.

No. 20. An act to explain and amend an act for the sale of certain confiscated British property.

No. 21. A Supplement to the act to authorize the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, to convey certain lands in Wiccomico manor to several of the tenants thereof.

No. 22. An act, entitled, A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to raise a sum of money for the payment of the officers and soldiers of the line of this state, from the first day of August seventeen hundred and eighty, to the first day of January seventeen hundred and eighty-one.
