WHEREAS John Jarman, a draught in a class of militia for Queen-Anne's county under the act of October seventeen hundred and eighty, entitled, An act to procure recruits, furnished a recruit to serve during the war, as by a certificate of general Smallwood, under the act of November session seventeen hundred and eighty-one, entitled, An act to raise recruits, appears: And whereas the four shillings per cent. on the class for which the said Jarman was draughted, has been collected and paid into the public treasury, to which said four shillings per cent. the said Jarman is entitled: Therefore, RESOLVED, That the intendant pay to John Jarman, or his order, the sum of thirty-two pounds current money.
