THIS house have considered your message of the 19th instant, by James Lloyd, Esquire.
We are very desirous of making a liberal provision for the governor, the chancellor, and the judges, and wish the calcumstances of our people would justify this house in accoung to the salar: s proposed by the senate. If time will permit we shall attempt at provide particular sunds to the care the payment of the salaries established by our bill. It will plays be in the power, as it will certainly be in the inclination, of the legislature, to make such alterations in the present salaries as the ability of government will permit.

As the chancellor must nee stirily have great trouble, from the number of disputes relative to the grant of lands, we are willing to make him compensation, and to add a lause to the bill for the civil list, allowing him the sum of two hundred pounds current money for the next tear.

This house will consent to limit the number of judges in the courts of appeals, and that when any vacancy may happen, the number shall not exceed three, until the abilities of the state will

justify an increase of the estab ishment.

We accede to your proposed conscrence on the bill to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable tobacco, and wish the conference to confer on teveral other important matters necessary to be done at this session; and we have nominated Mell's. Chase, Brice Worthington, Dent, Digges, and Fielder Bowie, to join the gentlemen appointed by the senate.
