Being the SECOND SESSION of this ASSEMBLY.

TUESDAY the tenth day of April, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, being the day appointed by his excellency the governor, by proclamation, for the meeting of the general assembly, on that day appeared in the senate,

W E D N E S D A Y, April 11, 1787.

THE same members appeared as on yesterday. The honourable Daniel Carroll, Esquire, appeared in the senate. The members present adjourn till to-morrow morning.

T H U R S D A Y, April 12, 1787.

THE same members appeared as on yesterday. The honourable George Plater and William Harrison, Esquires, appeared in the senate. The members present adjourn till to-morrow morning.

F R I D A Y, April 13, 1787.

THE same members appeared as on yesterday. The honourable George Gale, John Hall, William Perry and Peregrine Tilghman, Esquires, appeared in the senate. The members present adjourn till to-morrow morning.

S A T U R D A Y, April 14, 1787.

THE same members appeared as on yesterday, except John Hall, Esquire. Edward Lloyd and William Harrison, Esquires, qualified in the presence of the other members before Robert Couden, Esquire, one of the justices of the peace for Anne Arundel county, by taking the several oaths directed by the constitution and form of government, and subscribing a declaration of their belief in the christian religion.

A sufficient number of members being present to compose a senate, they proceeded to the election of a president. The ballot box was prepared, the ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof it appeared, that the honourable George Plater, Esquire, had a majority of votes; whereupon it is declared in the senate, that the honourable George Plater, Esquire, is duly elected president of the senate.

The proceedings from Tuesday to this day were read.
The senate adjourns till Monday morning.
