

The resolution respecting the governor and council's drawing orders, was read the second time by especial order and assented to, and, with the above resolutions, and the resolution respecting Samuel Sterett, was sent to the house of delegates by Nicholas Hammond, Esquire.

His excellency the governor attending, ORDERED, That Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and William Perry, Esquires, wait on the house of delegates, and inform them, that his excellency the governor is attending in the senate for the purpose of signing and sealing the engrossed bills, and request their attendance.

The speaker, attended by the members of the house of delegates, appeared in the senate, and the following engrossed bills were presented by the speaker to his excellency the governor, who signed and sealed the same in the presence of both houses.

No. 3. An act to prevent the going at large of swine, goats and geese, in Elkton, in Cecil county.
