T U E S D A Y, December 6, 1791.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of Friday and yesterday were read.

The bills and resolutions which were delivered on yesterday by the clerk of the house of delegates, and the resolution respecting Lazarus Harman, were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Agreeably to the order of the day, the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the laying out of certain roads in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk of the senate.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act to lay out certain roads in Anne-Arundel and Montgomery counties, thus endorsed; "By the house of delegates, December 2, 1791. Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the preamble insert "because the petitioners have but lately got possession of the books and papers of the said John Beall, and for that reason have not been able to proceed to a collection of the said balances."

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to freighten and amend the post-road from Havre-de-Grace to Baltimore-town, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. After the word "county;" in the fourth line of the enacting clause, insert "not including any of the former jury."
