The bill, entitled, An act to ratify an amendment of the constitution of the United States of America, proposed by congress to the legislatures of the several states, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act to withdraw the funds from Washington and Saint-John's colleges, be referred to John Campbell, Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and Robert Smith, Esquires, to consider and report thereon, and that the committee be and are hereby directed to give notice thereof to the visitors and principals of the respective colleges, in order that they may personally, or in writing, make any communications which they may deem necessary.

The president communicates to the senate a memorial from the visitors and governors of Saint-John's college, praying that a day be appointed at which they may be heard by counsel at the bar of the house; which was read, and referred to the committee appointed to report on the bill, entitled, An act for withdrawing the funds from Washington and Saint-John's colleges.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers to the clerk of the senate the following bills, viz. WE are fully impressed with the impropriety of the legislatures interfering in partial cases, but particular cases may exist when a departure from that rule will be fully justified; the cases of John Brent, Alexander Smith and Sarah Hanson, we conceive to be of that description. The facts contained in their petitions have been fully proved to the satisfaction of this house.
