RESOLVED, That the governor and council be empowered to draw an order on the treasury, in favour of the person so appointed, for such compensation as may be deemed reasonable.

The bill, entitled, An act for the destruction of crows, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. Strike out the words "or persons" in the third, sixth, seventh and tenth lines from the top. After the word "crows" in the sixteenth line insert "was or." At the end of the bill insert the following clause: "This act to continue and be in force till the thirtieth day of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-eight."

On motion, the following message was prepared, read and agreed to, and, with the last mentioned bill and amendments, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
