

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS; November, 1795. 19

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers to the clerk of the senate a bill, entitled, An act to revive and make valid the proceedings of the levy court of Kent county, thus endorsed; "By the house of delegates, November 30, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

 "By the house of delegates, December 7, 1795: Read the second time and will pass.  
 "By order, W. HARWOOD, clk."

The bill, entitled, An act to alter the public road leading from Miles river ferry through the land of Jacob Loockerman, of Talbot county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. In the 11th line of the 2d page, after the word "road," add "and before the same is opened." In the 12th line of the 2d page, after the word "out," add "and opened."

Which said bill and amendments were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Richard Sprigg, junior, Esquire, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the president the bill, entitled, An act for erecting a bridge over the Eastern branch of Patowmack river; which was read the second time and will pass.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

**T**HE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to revive and make valid the proceedings of the levy court of Kent county, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for erecting a bridge over the Eastern branch of Patowmack river, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers to the clerk of the senate a bill, entitled, An additional supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps, passable for horse and foot, thus endorsed; "By the house of delegates, November 30, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers to the clerk of the senate a bill, entitled, An act to lay out and open a public waggon road from Hughes's coaling ground, on the south mountain, to intersect the road, at or near Joseph Staley's, leading to Frederick-town, thus endorsed; "By the house of delegates, December 7, 1795: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

"By order, W. HARWOOD, clk."  
 "By the house of delegates, December 8, 1795: Read the second time and will pass.  
 "By order, W. HARWOOD, clk."

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The account of seals and taxes received by the register in chancery, was referred to the consideration of the house of delegates, and sent there by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of the navigation of Dividing creek, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. First page, 17th line, strike out the words "before any magistrate of Worcester or Somerset counties, as the case may require," and insert "by action of debt in the county court of the county in which the offence may have been committed." Second page, 3d line, after the word "committed" insert "to be applied towards the improvement of the navigation of the said creek."

On motion, ORDERED, That the agent forthwith lay before this house the following accounts, to wit: First. An account of the money and certificates received by him, in virtue of his office, from the time of his appointment to the first day of November, 1793, arranged under distinct heads, according to the branches of the revenue or accounts on which the sums were respectively received, specifying the names of the persons of whom the said sums were respectively received, and the amount he paid into the treasury. Second. An account of the transactions within the period aforesaid that were under his superintendence, stating them in detail under distinct heads according to the rate of commission allowed him, specifying the rate and amount of the commission he drew or was within that period entitled to draw. Thirdly. Similar and separate accounts for the periods between the 1st of November, 1793, and the 1st of November, 1794, and also between the 1st of November, 1794, and the 1st of November, 1795.

ORDERED, That the clerk of the senate furnish the agent with a copy of the above order.

The bill, entitled, An act to revive and make valid the proceedings of the levy court of Kent county, was read the second time by especial order and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. After the word "and" in the 6th line, insert "to transact." At the end of the bill insert, "provided that ten days previous notice be given by the clerk of the county of the time of such meeting, by advertisement set up at the court-house door and other public places."

Which said bill and amendments, together with the bill, entitled, An act for the preservation of Dividing creek, with the amendments thereto, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
