BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, December 22, 1795. RESOLVED, That Valentine Brother, Esquire, of Frederick town, be and he is hereby authorifed to fell and dispose of, under the direction of the governor and council, on the best possible terms, for the benefit of the state, all guipowder and brimstone now in the magazine at Frederick, and all such arms and accourrements in the armoury at Frederick as are unsit for use without previ-

ous repairs, and the faid Valentine Brother shall be entitled to a commission of three per cent. on the amount of such sales, as a compensation for his services; provided, that before he shall proceed to make any fale as aforefaid, he shall give bond to the state, with such security as the governor and council shall approve, conditioned for the faithful discharge of the trust hereby committed to him, and for the payment into the treasury of the western shore of all monies by him received in virtue thereof, within three months next after such receipts, after deducting the amount of his faid com-

missions, which shall be ascertained by the auditor-general.

RESPLYED, That in case it shall be deemed necessary to transport the said powder to Baltimoretown, or other place, for fale, or to furnish casks for the purpose of containing and securing the same, the governor and council shall be authorised to draw upon the treasury in favour of the said Valenting Brother, for such sum of money as will enable him to procure the said casks, and to effect the faid transportation, an account of the application of which money shall be rendered by the faid Valenting Brother to the auditor-general, and the surplus unexpended, if any, shall be paid by him into the treasury, and his aforesaid bond shall be liable therefor.
