Amendments proposed. In the 4th line of the 3d page, after the word "appointment" insert "and assessed on the books of the assessors to the amount of one thousand dollars." In the 2d line from the bottom of the 4th page, in the interlineation, after the word "and" insert "of the." In the 5th line from the bottom of the 5th page, after the word "of" insert the word "the." In the interlineation of the same line, after the word "and" insert "of the." In the 6th line of clause A strike out the words "an inhabitant of the ward for which he shall be chosen," and insert "assessed on the books of the assessors to the amount of two thousand dollars." In the 9th line of the 6th page strike out from the word "up" to the word "by" in the 10th line. Strike out the proviso contained between the 4th and 5th lines from the bottom of the 11th page. In the 8th line of the 14th page strike out the words "appeal or."

The following message was prepared, read and agreed to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
