The bill, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act, entitled, An act to incorporate an insurance company in Baltimore-town, and to enable any one company or stockholder in said company to hold a greater number of shares therein than by said act it is now permitted any one company or person to hold, was read the second time and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support of Cassandra Thompion, was read the second time and will pass.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to ascertain the allowance of jurymen and witnesses of the general court, and the several county and orphans courts in the state, was read the second time and will pass.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps, passable for horse and foot, was read the second time and will not pass.

The resolution in favour of Frederick Green, and the four bills next before mentioned, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
