

The resolution in favour of Archibald Robinson and Thomas Barton, administrators of James Barton, was read the second time by especial order and assented to.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the more effectual collection of the county charges in Allegany county, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and, with the resolution next before mentioned, sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

T U E S D A Y, December 31, 1799.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Queen-Anne's county, was read the second time by especial order and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. After the word "thereon" in the 16th line of the 16th page insert the words "such persons." Strike out from the word "owners" in the 5th line of the 17th page to the end of the clause, and insert the words "of slaves, as many male slaves as they may deem necessary, not exceeding one half of the number of labouring slaves belonging to such person on any one day; provided that such owner shall not be compelled to render more service in any one year by the labour of his or her slaves than his or her road taxes may amount to; and provided that the labour of said slaves shall not be required as aforesaid during the season of harvest."

On motion, Mr. Dorsey delivers to the president a bill, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand eight hundred; which was read the first and second time by especial order and will pass.

The following message was prepared, read and agreed to.

BY THE SENATE, DECEMBER 31, 1799.

GENTLEMEN,

WE have finished all the business before us, and being convinced that we shall not have a senate after Thursday next, we take the liberty of suggesting to you the propriety of acting upon such business only as cannot well be dispensed with. We flatter ourselves, that leaving the policy of the changes contemplated by you to the consideration of a future legislature, you will think it adviseable to adopt the additional provisions which are offered, and we accordingly solicit your concurrence therewith.
