Bond, or those interested in the land hereafter mentioned, shall come in and pay to the state of Maryland the composition money due on a certificate returned to the western shore landoffice, called Bone's Meadows, containing twenty-two thousand and twenty acres, according to the certificate, in the name of James Earle, junior, William Stoddart Bond, Samuel Brown and Peregrine Fitzhugh, bearing date the eleventh day of May, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, lying in Allegany county, agreeably to the bond executed by the faid William S. Bond, and his securities, to the state of Maryland, on or before the first day of April next, the title of the land therein mentioned shall, on the payment of the caution money by the fecurities, be and the fame is hereby declared to be vested in them, as tenants in common, in fee-simple; provided, that if the faid William S. Bond, or those interested as aforesaid, shall, on or before the first day of April, eighteen hundred and two, pay to the faid securities the sum of money they shall have paid to the state, as securities for said Bond to the state of Maryland, with legal interest from the time of payment, the said fecurities shall reconvey the same to the said William S.
