The bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for erecting a public school in Frederick county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the seventh section of the bill and insert the following: "And be it enacted, that the trustees, or the majority of them, shall direct what proportion of the annual donation shall be paid to the principal, and the residue thereof shall by the principal be annually apportioned among the subordinate tutors, provided that such apportionment may be changed or altered by the trustees."

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal the fourth section of an act of assembly, entitled, An act for the advancement of justice, passed at October session, seventeen hundred and sixty-three, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
