

## VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS, NOVEMBER SESSION, 1801.

§ 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, that the law of this state, which authorizes the levy court of any county to assess and levy a sum of money on the taxable property thereof for the purpose of improving the navigation of any river or stream, and for making roads, bridges, and other works, and for the support of public schools, and for other purposes, and which is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed. And be it enacted, that the levy court of the said county be and they are hereby vested with power and authority to apportion the labourers on the several public roads in said county, and to make such further regulations to carry the road laws of said county into effect as they think proper." In the 7th line of the 4th page, after the word "owner" insert "or owners." Strike out the last enacting clause of the bill.

Mr. McCulloch, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the better regulation of apprentices; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The senate adjourns till to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
