

Amendments proposed. In the last line of the first enacting clause strike out the word "ten" and insert the word "three." Strike out from the word "children" in the 2d line of the 3d page to the word "any" in the 5th line of the same page and insert "for the term which by law other females shall or may be bound." In the 4th line of the 5th page strike out the words "for ever hereafter."

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for establishing a turnpike road from the Burnt mill, about one mile below the mouth of George's creek, on the Patowmack river, to the nearest western navigation, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. Strike out the preamble. After the word "payments" in the last line but one of the 3d page insert "within twenty days from the time when it ought to have been paid." Strike out from the word "paid" in the last line of the 3d page to the word "his" in the same line. Before the word "his" in the same line insert "also." Strike out the words "forfeited shares" in the 1st and 2d lines of the 4th page and insert "forfeitures." Strike out from the word "votes" in the 7th line of the 4th page to the end of that section and insert "And be it enacted, that each stockholder may sell and transfer his stock, or any part thereof, and on the transfer being entered in the road book; in the presence of the stockholder, or his lawful attorney, the person to whom the same is transferred shall thereupon be entitled to all the rights and privileges vested in the original stockholder by this act." In the 1st line of the 5th page strike out the word "Hager's" and insert "Elizabeth." After the word "next" in the 13th line of the 11th page insert "Allegany county." Strike out after the word "court" in the 13th line of the 11th page the following words, "of the county wherein the same shall be." Strike out the words "or information in any court of record of this state" in the 13th line of the 12th page and insert "in said court." Strike out the word "however" in the 14th line of the 12th page.
