

T U E S D A Y, December 15, 1801.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The president communicates to the senate a letter from Jeremiah T. Chase, Esquire, resigning his appointment as a commissioner for settling the southern and western limits of this state; which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Caroline county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. Strike out "November" in the 3d line of the 1st clause and insert "May." Strike out "second Monday in October" in 5th line of same clause and insert "first Monday in April." Strike out "county" in the 5th line same clause and insert "levy." Strike out "county" in the 1st line of 2d clause and insert "levy." Strike out "next October term" in the 2d line of same clause and insert "first meeting in April next." Strike out "November" in the last line of same clause and insert "May." Strike out "November" in the 8th line of 2d page and insert "May." Strike out "November" in the 1st line of 3d page and insert "May." Strike out "county" in the 10th line of 3d page and insert "levy." Strike out "October term" in 10th line 3d page and insert "first meeting in April, in the year eighteen hundred and three." Strike out "county" in the 6th line 4th page and insert "levy." Strike out "county" in the 8th line 4th page and insert "levy."

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "may" in the 5th line 2d page and insert "might."

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand eight hundred and two, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to enable John Sprigg Belt, James Walker and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the collection of the county tax in certain districts in Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "hath" in the 4th line of the 1st clause and insert "have."

The bill, entitled, An act to correct a mistake in the beginning of lot number three thousand two hundred and eighty-seven of the lands lying westward of Fort Cumberland, was read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act respecting lotteries, and to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time and will pass.

— BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 15, 1801.  
RESOLVED, That all proceedings against William Rose, James Booker, Philemon Willis and Richard Barnaby, on account of their securityship for a certain William Stoddart Bond, in a bond given by him to the state of Maryland on the twenty-third day of January, in the year seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, for the sum of two thousand four hundred and thirty-eight pounds sixteen shillings, conditioned for the payment of the caution money for a tract of land called Bone's Meadows, situate in Allegany county, containing twenty-two thousand two hundred and one half acres of land, be suspended until the first day of December, eighteen hundred and three; provided nevertheless, that the said petitioners shall confess judgment, if not yet obtained, where suits have been
