word "oath" in the last line of the 13th page insert "or affirmation." Strike out the letter "a" first used in the last line of the 16th page. Strike out the word "man" in the same line. Strike out the word "one" in the 1st line 17th page and insert "two." Strike out the words "fifty cents" in the 3d line of the 17th page and insert "one dollar." Strike out from the word "employed" in the 2d line of the 19th page to the word "that" in the following line. After the word "assembly" in the 13th line of the 19th page insert "provided the said levy court shall be of opinion their funds are sufficient for that purpose." Strike out "a justice of the peace for said county" in the 2d and 3d lines of the 20th page and insert "two justices of the said levy court." After the word "Baltimore" in the 10th line of the 21st page insert "county." After the word "reasonable" in the 15th line of the 21st page insert the following: "And be it enacted, that the levy court are hereby authorized and empowered to contract with any person or persons to keep in repair any of the aforesaid turnpike roads, after the same shall be completed as directed by this act, or such part thereof as they shall think proper so to contract for."

The resolution respecting sandy inhabitants of Frederick county, the bill to authorize the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to open the road therein mentioned, the bill respecting evidence in certain cases, the supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the better supporting the magistrates in the administration of justice within this province, and to repeal the third section thereof, and the bill to correct a mistake in the beginning of lot three thousand two hundred and eighty-seven of the lands westward of Fort Cumberland, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
