Whereas by a resolution of the general assembly of Maryland, passed at November session, one thousand sen hundred and ninety-five, William Pinkney, William Cooke and Philip Barton Key, Esquires, were appoint on behalf of this state to fettle and adjust the western and southern boundaries between this state and the con monwealth of Virginia: And whereas at November session, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, William Cooke fignified to the general affembly that he could not attend the execution of the above powers, and the William Pinkney was on business out of this state, and Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and Jeremiah Town Chase, Esquires, were appointed with Philip Barton Key, to carry the aforegoing resolution into effect: A whereas the faid resolution hath not yet been carried into effect, and Philip Barton Key hath removed out this state, and Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, and Jeremiah Townley Chase, have signified to this general affe bly that they cannot attend to the execution of the above powers; therefore, RESOLVED, That the govern and council be and they are hereby authorised and required to appoint three proper persons as commissionen the part of this state, to meet such commissioners as may be appointed for the same purpose by the commonwell of Virginia, to fettle and adjust, by mutual compact between the two governments, the western and southern lim of this state, and the dividing lines and boundaries between this state and the said commonwealth; and also fettle and adjust as aforesaid any claim of this. state, or the said commonwealth, to territory within the limit the other; and the faid commissioners, so to be appointed, are hereby required to report their proceedings wirtue of their faid appointment and authority to the general assembly of this state, at their next session as the same shall have been concluded, for confirmation.
