The resolution in favour of John M. Burges and Mary Burges was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Abraham G. Hammond was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Somerset county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Peregrine Briscoe was read the second time and assented to with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "of" in the 5th line to the end of the resolution and insert "November next."

Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Elizabeth Townsend, and the heirs of Levin Townsend, of Worcester county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to streighten and amend the road leading from Leonard-town, in Saint-Mary's county, to Newport, in Charles county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the last clause.

Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise the judges of elections for the third district in Caroline county to change the place of holding elections in the said district, upon reconsideration was passed with the proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the first proviso in the first clause.

Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, was read the second time by a special order and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act to correct a mistake in the act therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of William Singleton and George Johnson, the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the opening of Second-street, in the city of Baltimore, the bill for the relief of John Leef and Thomas Ritter, of Baltimore county, and the bill to lay out a road from William's Port to the Pennsylvania line, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The senate adjourns till 5 o'clock post meridiem.
