Amendments proposed. Strike out from the word "of" in the 2d line to the word "on" in the 3d line and insert "November next." Strike out from the word "county" in the 11th line to the end of the resolution and insert "Resolved, that the said securities be released from the payment of the nine per cent. interest imposed on them, provided they pay the balance due on or before the said first day of November next, with six per cent. interest thereon."

The resolution in favour of John Smith Brookes, and the resolution respecting brigade inspectors, were severally read the second time and assented to.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act respecting the punishment of criminals, was read the second time by a special order and will not pass.
