Amendments proposed. After the word "lane" in the 2d line from the bottom insert "provided that the entire width of the said street from the east side thereof shall not exceed sixteen and a half feet." Strike out the words "name and" in same line. At the end of the bill add, "by the name of M'Clelland's street."

The bill, entitled, An act to augment the shares of the Susquehanna canal company, was read the second time by a special order and passed.

The bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to erect Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-six, was read the second time by a special order and will not pass.

The bill, entitled, An act respecting the register of wills for Calvert county, was read the second time by a special order and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act to declare the effect of judgments upon lands and tenements, and to direct the sheriffs in the service of executions, and for other purposes, was read the second time and will not pass.

Brookes, the resolution respecting brigade inspectors, the resolution in favour of the securities of Robert Sinclair, of Allegany county, the further supplement to an act, entitled, An act permitting the proprietors of lots binding on the water at the west end of the Basin, in Baltimore-town, to extend and improve the same, the act to enable the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and complete the levy of said county for the year eighteen hundred and one, the bill erecting a lazaretto on the waters of Patapsco for the reception of persons infected with malignant contagious diseases, the supplement to an act, entitled, An act respecting the public roads in Washington county, passed at November session, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, the bill to correct a mistake in the act therein mentioned, the further supplement to an act, entitled, An act respecting the punishment of criminals, the bill respecting the proceedings on a commission issued out of Prince-George's county court concerning a tract of land called Part of Good Luck, the bill respecting Ten Feet lane, in the city of Baltimore, the bill respecting the register of wills for Calvert county, the bill to augment the shares of the Susquehanna canal company, and the further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to erect Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-six, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

BY THE SENATE, DECEMBER 31, 1801.

RESOLVED, That the governor transmit to our representatives in congress a copy of the resolutions passed this session, relative to the loan of the six per cent. stock to the commissioners of the city of Washington, together with a copy of the commissioners memorial, and to request their aid in obtaining a transfer of the stock and the payment of interest thereon, according to the terms of the resolutions.

The bill, entitled, An act to appoint a trustee to take care of that part of the Indian lands, in Dorchester county, which was laid off for, and occupied by, a certain Molley Mulberry, lately deceased, and the bill, entitled, An act to revive and make permanent the acts of assembly therein mentioned, were severally read the second time by a special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.
