ters have or may be granted, after complying with the requifites prescribed by the act to which this is a supply ment, to bring fuits for the recovery of debts or other property of the deceased, in the fame manner as if fuch collector had been duly appointed executor or administrator. And be it enacted, that all property recovered or received by the collector in virtue of the powers velted in him by this act, shall be delivered to the person ob. taining the letters testamentary or of administration, and in case of neglect or refusal, such collector may be proceeded against in the same manner as prescribed by the original act. And be it enacted, that an executor or administrator shall not be bound to discover or take notice of any judgments or decrees obtained against the deceased, but such judgment or decree creditors shall exhibit in the same manner as other creditors, and in case the same shall not be exhibited, they shall be barred in the same manner they would have been if their claims rested on a bond or simple contract; provided, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to deprive fuch judgment or decree creditors of the preference given by the original act, when the claim: are in due time exhibited."
